





1."화이팅!" (HWAITING!)

Meaning:

- A phrase of encouragement, similar to "You got this!" or "Go for it!"
 Commonly used in sports, exams, or challenging situations.

Example Usage:
• "시험 잘 봐! 화이팅!" (Do well on your exam! Hwaiting!)





Meaning:

- Describes someone who is quick-witted and perceptive.
- "Nunchi" refers to the ability to read the room or understand unspoken cues.

Example Usage:
• "그 사람은 눈치가 빨라서 분위기를 잘 읽어요." (That person is quick-witted and reads the atmosphere well.)




3. "고생 많았어요" (GOSAENG MANASSEOYO)

Meaning:

- Means "You worked hard" or "You've been through a lot."
- Often used to acknowledge someone's effort or struggles.

Example Usage:
• "오늘 일 때문에 고생 많았어요." (You worked hard today.)




4. "잘 먹겠습니다" (JAL MEOKGETSEUMNIDA)

Meaning:

- A polite phrase meaning "I will eat well."
 Said before eating to show appreciation for the food.

Example Usage:

• Before a meal, say: "잘 먹겠습니다!"



















Meaning:

• Literally "big hands," but means someone is generous, especially with food.

Example Usage:
• "할머니는 손이 커서 항상 음식을 많이 주셔요." (Grandma is generous, so she always gives a lot of food.)

6. "세상 좁다" (SESANG JOBDA)

Meaning:

- "The world is small."
- Used when encountering surprising coincidences.


Example Usage:
• "우리 같은 학교 다녔어요? 세상 참 좁네요!" (We went to the same school? What a small world!)


7. "천천히 해" (CHEONCHEONHI HAE)

Meaning:

- "Take your time" or "No rush."
- Used to comfort someone or reassure them.

Example Usage:
• "너무 급하게 하지 마, 천천히 해!" (Don't rush too much, take your time!)






8. "바람 맞다" (BARAM MATDA)

Meaning:

- "To be stood up." Used when someone doesn't show up to an appointment.

Example Usage:
• "어제 소개팅에서 바람 맞았어." (I got stood up on my blind date yesterday.)






9. "죽겠다" (JUKGETDA)


Meaning:

"I feel like I'm going to die" –
 exaggeration for being exhausted, in
 pain, or overwhelmed.

Example Usage:
• "너무 피곤해서 죽겠다." (I'm so tired I could die.)







10. "내 마음대로" (NAE MAEMDEURO)

Meaning:

- "As I please" or "My way."
 Used to describe doing something based on personal preference.

Example Usage:
• "오늘은 내 마음대로 할 거야." (Today, I'm going to do things my way.)
